Little Doris Nenemse's journey with Retinoblastoma began 2 years ago when only one eye was affected. Doctors informed the parents surgery was required to remove one eye. Unable to afford the amount, they returned to their village to consider. Time passed and the cancer progressed into both eyes until filmmaker Leila Djansi found her and reached out to Dave Harper at Geodrill.

With the support of Geodrill, Doris would eventually undergo 8 cycles of chemotherapy and knee surgery at the Korle-bu Teaching Hospital in Ghana. She then continued to Fortis Hospital in India where high dose chemo was used to completely shrink one tumor and a prosthetic eye was inserted.

Doris begins pre-school in May 2021 and with another round of chemo, will be able to live an eye-patch free life and the other prosthetic eye inserted.
